Eligible Activities

- New construction or rehabilitation of affordable rental housing
- Conversion of non-residential property to serve as affordable rental housing



Basic Program Requirements

- Tenants must be income qualified
- Rents are restricted to ensure affordability
- Regulatory term of at least 30 years

Pre-Application Requirements

- Evidence of site control
- Market study/analysis
- Appraisal supporting acquisition costs
- Preliminary plans and specs
- ▼ Phase 1 Environmental Assessment

New Applications

- Applications <u>not</u> submitted previously in 2011 must first register and identify the project using the Consolidated Funding Application (CFA) located at **http://nyworks.ny.gov.**
- Once applicants have received their CFA ID Number (four digit number) they should contact HCR at (518) 473-2525 to receive the link to the CFA Multi-Family Program Application (formerly known as the CD Online).
- Applicants who are <u>not</u> currently registered in the CFA Multi-Family Program Application
 System must fill out an Applicant Registration Form and return it to HCR.
- Once registered in the CFA Multi-Family Program Application System, you will receive an email with the link to the MFP Application along with your user id and password.



Applications Previously Submitted in 2011

Applications previously submitted pursuant to a October 27, 2010 or May 11, 2011 Notice of Availability of State and Federal Funds do <u>not</u> require the submission of a new application through the CFA process if the applicant:

- Requests that the existing application be considered under the September 7, 2011
 CFA NOFA
- Certifies that the existing application remains valid
- × Provides an updated development timetable
